[Example 1] In the Case of a Student

- March 10 Graduated from a Japanese language school.
- March 31 “Student” status expired.
- April 1 The status changed to “Temporary Visitor.”



* Not eligible to receive the special cash payment (¥100,000) 😞

▪ May 20 The rule in Japan changed.

- May 21 Applied for “Designated Activities” at a regional immigration bureau.
- May 29 Acquired “Designated Activities (part-time work allowed).”
- Apply for the special cash payment at a city hall.

Up to 28 hours a week!

→ Receive the special cash payment (¥100,000) ! Allowed to work part-time! 😊
